Course Description: The investigation of death is one of the most important responsibilities a law enforcement agency can undertake. This 40-hour course will prepare the student to properly investigate all death cases. The focus will be on homicide investigation. Students will participate in the investigation of cases as part of small interactive groups.

Instructional Level: Students should be law enforcement officers (uniform or detective), investigators and other authorized officials who are responsible for investigating the deaths of human beings.
